Short description of the course:	
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The second half of the 20th century saw the beginning of agricultural industrialisation and the and the globalisation of the food trade. As the structure of the food trade changed, so did consumer habits. This process has brought with it a number of problems that are often not reflected in food prices. As a result, small-scale farming and consumption that supports local products are now being marginalised worldwide. We believe it is important to highlight the role of local farms based on local products in terms of sustainability, to counterbalance the rise of global food chains. Indeed, there is an important place in the economy of a region for organisations whose aim is not only to increase profits, but also to produce local products from local resources and sell them on the local market. A sustainable and environmentally responsible economy is based on local products and the key role of local products in the local economy. The aim of the programme is to raise awareness of the importance of local products and to provide good examples to reinforce their relevance in a region's economy.

At the same time, the BIP programme will give participating students the opportunity to gain insight into good practices in other countries.
